Spy Gadgets - 1960s Era

All of the following spy gadgets were invented and applied by the KGB, MI6, CIA and other organizations during the past - in the operational work in the territory of a potential enemy. Currently (as of 2017) they can be found in the international spy museum, which is located in Washington.

The perfect gadget for a cold-blooded killer who imagines him or herself an establishment figure - is an umbrella able to bruise poison. This weapon was developed by the KGB. A similar device was used in the elimination of the Bulgarian dissident Georgi Markov, who was killed in 1978 in London.

Markov departed the bus and felt a stab in the shin. Turning around, he saw a gentleman with an umbrella. The owner of an umbrella apologized and left in an unknown direction.

George died three days after the injection of a strange toxin, having to tell before he died of an episode with an umbrella. With the opening of his legs in the calf area, was found a tiny metal capsule with ricin, which is responsible for the poisoning of the writer.

The camera in the button

Ajax - the code name for a hidden camera, was developed by the KGB during the 1970s. The camera lens is fitted into the button of a cloak, and in order to take a picture, the carrier has to activate the trigger mechanism disposed in the pocket. What is interesting - it is only one of many models used in those years, both in the USSR and North America, and Europe.

Coin-cache

Developed by the KGB during the 1950s, a hollow coin could be useful to the spy for storing microfilm and microdots. The secret accessed via means of a needle stick in a shallow hole in the front part of the coin.

During the 1950s, the USSR State Security Committee developed a pair of hollow cuff links, in which it was possible to fit all kinds of microfilm and move them across the border.
